Bear's Bredenes

- Acanthus mollis, commonly known as Bear's Breeches, is a herbaceous perennial plant in the genus Acanthus, native to the Mediterranean region.
- It grows to 2 m tall, with basal clusters of deeply lobed and cut, shining dark green leaves up to 1 m long and 20 cm broad.
- The flowers are tubular, whitish, lilac or rose with spiny green or purplish bracts, and produced on stout spikes.
- It flowers in late spring or early summer.
- It grows in dry areas, and is tolerant of drought and shade.
- The plants are propagated from tubers and tend to form large, localized clumps which can survive for several decades.
